COP 23 started this week in Germany, in Bonn.

#CooperateToMakeaSuccessofEnergyTransition

The 23rd edition of the UN Climate Change Conference (COP23) is being held from 6 to 17 November in Germany, in Bonn, under the chairmanship of the Fiji Islands. « Aim for further, faster ambition together »: the objective of this edition is to encourage the States to take a leap forward in their ambition to fight global warming and set the world on a safer and more prosperous development path.

Two years after the major step represented by the landmark adoption of the Paris Climate Change Agreement COP23 will not only further fuel momentum among cities, States, regions, territories, companies and civil societies supporting the national climate change action plans, but also highlight the temperature goal agreed worldwide and the huge objectives of the 2030 Agenda for sustainable development.

The inter-governmental negotiations will be completed at COP24 in Poland next year and will open up the way for upward revision of the national climate change action plans so as to take science better into account for the 2019-2020 window.

Furthermore, the governments are also going to work on what can be called the Paris Agreement's « operating system » – i.e. a comprehensive description of the means and methods for helping all the governments, supported by the non-Party players, to best attain the goals of the Paris Agreement both now, and during the coming years and decades. The deadline for this matter is also planned to be in Poland in 2018. (Source: UN press release).
